Open Air Training:

Aaron Wentz, Director of Open Air Campaigners in Boston



Aaron Wentz is the director of **Open Air Campaigners (OAC)** in **Boston**. Aaron is a graduate of **Moody Bible Institute** with a B.A. degree in Evangelism/Discipleship and is currently the **Boston Branch Director of OAC**. Aaron & Karen have a son, Ky'el, and a daughter, Kasiah.

The goal of OAC Boston is to reach Americans and internationals with the Gospel and bring them into fellowship with local evangelical churches. This is accomplished by going out into the streets, universities and subways, publicly proclaiming the Gospel as Jesus and the Apostle Paul did in the New Testament. After the message people sometimes stay to ask questions and engage in conversation. Gospel material is given out, including an address for follow-up.

Half of the time their witnessing is to children. Most inner-city children have little or no Biblical foundation and need to be evangelized just as Jesus said (Matthew 19:13-15, 28:18-20). Aaron and the other **OAC** staff go into neighborhoods, parks and housing developments to gather children to listen to the Gospel. **OAC** members talk with them after the meetings and offer free Bible lessons through the mail.

Staff evangelist, Eric Briscoe, was saved at the age of 13 at Happy “T” Ranch in New Hampshire. He is a member of and grew up in the First Baptist Church located in Weymouth, Massachusetts. In this local church setting, Eric has served the Lord as an Elder, in the visitation ministry, conducting pulpit supply, serving on the pulpit committee and as chapel speaker for the Christian school and AWANA program.



He also studied at Massasort Community College, receiving an Associate Degree in 1971 and was immediately drafted into the Army where he served two years with the 82nd Airborne Division. A Bachelor of Arts Degree was earned in 1975 from Boston State College in Political Science and Math. God led Eric to a young lady by the name of Diane who would become his life partner, they were married in 1976. During 1981-1982, Eric attended Word of life School of Youth Ministries in the state of New York.

During student days at Word of life, Eric was introduced to the Open Air Campaigners ministry. It was in the spring of 1982 that the Lord made it clear that he was to do the work of an evangelist. That year, he joined the OAC Philadelphia branch as an evangelist. Then, in 1986, he became the Boston Branch Director. An additional ministry came Eric's way as he was appointed OAC/USA Field Director in 1991.
